### Summer updates and activities

While the summer is well underway, there are lots of things happening on the expanding rail trail network in Northampton. This network serves critically important multipurpose transportation and recreation needs. I'm excited about what the Friends of Northampton Trails and Greenways is doing to make this connected system a reality.

This mini-newsletter is designed to give you a quick update and let you know how you can learn more about the trails, and get involved. I hope to see you at one of these events, or on the trails!

Map publication We've been busy distributing the map and brochure, and wanted to make sure you had a copy (as well as one to share with someone else). Please thank our sponsors (Bidwell ID, Serio's, Cooper's Corner, Hott Productions, Northampton Bike, Sugar Maple Trailside Inn and last but not least Craig Della Penna) when you see them!

Signage project Efforts are underway to provide onroad signage to help people navigate between the Norwottuck extension and the Northampton bikeway until the tunnel under the King Street rail line is in place.

**Kiosk proposal** We are working to submit a proposal for state funding of kiosks that detail the trail network throughout town.

There are also some exciting updates on local trails:

**Norwottuck connection** the State Department of Conservation and Recreation is putting the final

touches on the Damon Road to Woodmont connector (1/2 mile), and is tentatively planning a September official opening for the trail.

Roundhouse to Earle St/Grove St. the bids from this project are scheduled to be opened sometime this month. When completed, it will connect Downtown to the skateboard park/Felt Building/Smith College physical plant by the old State Hospital and Route 10 (with eventual continuation to Easthampton and the Manhan Rail Trail).

Rail with trail along King Street this project is a major priority, as it will provide a connection between the Norwottuck trail and downtown, with a fence separating the trail from the active rail line. Major efforts are underway to include this project in the Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP), which determines how state transportation projects are prioritized.

Leeds extension this project would extend from Look Park to the Williamsburg line, providing connectivity between Leeds School and the JFK Middle School. A June forum on roundabouts addressed how the reworked intersection of Route 9 and Bridge St. would accommodate this path.

Norwottuck resurfacing discussions are now underway on how to resurface the Norwottuck (which has suffered extensive root damage in recent years as well as the continued problems of glass that was included in the original construction).

The Friends of Northampton Trails and Greenways, organized in 2006, helps to support these trails by rais-

## Mass Central Rail Trail meeting

The Mass Central Rail Trail coalition is working to build out the rail trail network stretching from Northampton to Boston. On Thursday, July 26th, the MCRT coalition will be meeting in Northampton.

There will be two guided tours, both at 3:00pm. Susan Voss will be leading a walking tour of the existing and soon to be built connections through downtown Northampton (leaving from Northampton Brewery's Hampton Avenue entrance). Craig Della Penna will be leading a biking tour from the Sugar Maple Trailside Inn that will head east on the City of Northampton

Bikeway—the oldest municipally built rail trail in New England—through the edge of Stop and Shop parking lot, cross Rt 5 and then head onto the soon to be opened, newly built extension of the Norwottuck Trail.

At 5:00pm, both groups will adjourn to the Northampton Brewery for a short business meeting and then a group dinner (\$10 not including beverages).
